Lighting of the Fourth Candle

Last Sunday we lit the candle of **Hope**, remembering the hope which comes in Christ, the candle of **Peace**, remembering God's dream of a peaceful world, and the candle of **Joy**, remembering the Spirit within us who brings joy.

Two purple candles and the **rose-coloured candle** are lit and allowed to burn.
