CHRISTMAS MESSAGE & GREETINGS FROM BISHOP MICHAEL MAXWELL

Dear Family of God,

Today, we commence the season of Christmas to celebrate that moment in history when our God came to us in human form through the birth of Mary's boy child, Jesus Christ. I pray that our hearts, at this time, are filled with the joy of the Lord as we celebrate God's glorious and gracious act of repairing the breach that existed between God and us and our relationships with each other. This separation was caused, not by God but due to the sins of the first Adam and his descendants. To repair that breach, and to restore us to a wholesome relationship with Him and one another, God came to earth that first Christmas in His Son Jesus Christ. Celebrate Love in Jesus: Make room in your heart to welcome Christ, the ultimate expression of God's love.

As receivers of the good news, we are called to pass it on to make real its promise to those in need. It is a message about our God that enhances our lives and motivates us into action, bringing benefit to ourselves and God.
