THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION will be administered via the *Common Cup*. However, the option of *intinction* remains available. Children and young adults may participate in the following ways:

- Only the **host** will be administered to children aged **3–15**, unless they are confirmed or have received parental permission to partake of both kinds. *Infants and toddlers* (those under 3 years) may receive Communion only **from their parents**, and **not directly from the minister**.
- Those aged **16 and older** are welcome to receive **of both kinds**. Please note that “both kinds” currently refers to the reception of the consecrated **bread and wine via intinction**.

If you are comfortable and physically able, you may **kneel or stand** at the altar when receiving Communion or a blessing. Should you experience any mobility challenges, kindly inform the Ushers so that the Sacrament may be brought to you.
