DEACONS CUPBOARD: Members are reminded to make their contribution towards the Deacon's Cupboard for distribution to the less fortunate in our community. Items required for the hamper are: bath soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes, powder, hand cream, toilet paper (must be individually wrapped), tinned meats/sausages/tuna, etc., tinned vegetables (peas, mixed vegetables, baked beans etc.), tinned fruit, tinned/package fruit juices, rice, pasta/chowmein, tinned/package soups, sugar, cereals (quaker oats/corn flakes, etc.), flour, corn meal, tea bags, milo/ovaltine/horlicks, etc., evaporated milk, detergents, soap powder, biscuits - sodabix or eclipse or small pkgs.
